Your tour

This alternating tour leads you along the Baltic Sea cycle path and through the hinterland in the northwest of Mecklenburg, that is full of lakes. From the hanseatic town Lübeck, you first cycle along the coast into the hanseatic city Wismar, that are both famous and protected as a UNESCO world heritage site. Via the castle of Schwerin and the Eulenspiegel town Mölln, it goes back to Lübeck.

- → Closest airports: Hamburg

Parking in Lübeck

Bike handover

→ Arrival: Guests' rental bikes will be available at the arrival hotel.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Lübeck

Your bike tour starts in the old, magnificent Hanseatic city, which was named a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987. If you talk about Holstentor, marzipan and Thomas Mann, Lübeck immediately comes to mind. You should not miss a fish roll as a prelude to your vacation.

Day 2: Lübeck – Gross Schwansee / Boltenhagen, approx. 35 / 45 km + ferry trip

In Travemünde you can take a break to see Germany's oldest lighthouse, before continuing along the coast. Cycling through the Brooker Wald nature reserve, you soon reach Boltenhagen, the second oldest seaside resort in Mecklenburg. You can look over the entire bay from the cliffs. Alternatively you spend the night in Gross Schwansee.

Day 3: Boltenhagen – Wismar, approx. 30 km

You continue, mostly along the coast, to the old Hanseatic town of Wismar. From here we recommend a short trip to Poel island to explore its long sandy beaches and go for a swim. Historic city walls from the Thirty Year's War add charm to the island.

Day 4: Wismar - Schwerin, approx. 50 km

Today you follow the course of the Wallenstein Trench from Wismar to Schwerin Lake. You pass the village of Mecklenburg, which gave its name to the state and is famous for its Dutch mill. Via Bad Kleinen and Lübstorf, you cycle along the bank to the state capital of Schwerin.

Day 5: Day trip Schwerin Lake, approx. 45 km + boat trip

You have the whole day to explore Schwerin and the surrounding area. You could, for example, visit mighty Schwerin Castle or look inside Schwerin cathedral. It's also worth a cycle ride through the Schwerin lake district or taking a boat out on Schwerin Lake.

Day 6: Schwerin – Ratzeburg, approx. 65 km or approx. 40 km + Train ride

Today you have two alternatives:

Either you choose the longer and somewhat more strenuous route across the former border and first ride a short distance through the Schwerin lake district before reaching the Schaalsee region. Shortly after, you will enter Schleswig-Holstein and the Lauenburg Lakes Nature Park.

Alternatively, take the train in Schwerin to Büchen (not included) and cycle from here along the Elbe-Lübeck Canal on the Alte Salzstraße cycle path via the Eulenspiegel town of Mölln to Ratzeburg. In the middle of the Ratzeburger Lake lies the island town with its impressive brick cathedral.

Day 7: Ratzeburg - Lübeck, approx. 30 / 45 km

Also today there are two routes to choose from:

Either you cycle to Mölln first. In the Eulenspiegel Museum you will learn everything about Germany's most famous jester. The Old Salt Road leads through the town, an old trade route that was once used to transport the "white gold" from Lüneburg to the coast. You follow the Old Salt Road back to Lübeck.

Or you can take a shorter route along the eastern shore of the Great Ratzeburg Lake and the course of the river Wakenitz, which is still very much in its original state, to the center of Lübeck.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.

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
